Scope and Content

The UK based *Open Grid Service Architecture - Data Access and Integration* (OGSA-DAI) project has been producing and releasing middleware components required to access and integrate databases into a Grid environment for about a year now. We would like to use this mini-workshop as an opportunity for members of the UK e-Science community and further afield to tell the community and the OGSA-DAI developers how you have used OGSA-DAI within your project, the problems that OGSA-DAI has solved (or caused) and how you might like to see OGSA-DAI evolve in the near future. This will be an opportunity for those present to engage with the OGSA-DAI developers and influence what you would like to see in OGSA-DAI. The workshop will include a short presentation on the future roadmap of the OGSA-DAI software as is currently envisaged.

Submission of Abstracts

Clearly you should ask to be considered for the OGSA-DAI mini workshop. High quality workshop papers that are judged to be unsuitable for the workshop to which they are submitted will automatically be considered as regular papers.
